More about Streetsville:

Streetsville Secondary School is a learning community of students, parents, staff and the greater community that collaboratively supports student success. Since opening in 1958, the school has established a long-standing tradition of educational excellence. The school has grown in both spirit and numbers; today there are approximately 1,100 students, 64 teachers and 10 support staff.

A positive educational experience for all students is maximized through diverse programming, resources, language support and state-of-the-art equipment. In addition, Streetsville Secondary is one of the sites for the Secondary Regional Communications Program – Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). This program provides students identified with ASD with specialized learning and technological support.

The school's regional French Immersion program was introduced in September 2005. Students study français, géographie, sciences, histoire, éducation à la citoyenneté, exploration des choix de carrières, histoire du monde and Le Canada et le Monde: Une Analyse Géographique.

Students are encouraged to become a "Tiger" and take advantage of the variety of co-curricular programs, clubs and numerous athletic teams.
