SPECIALIST HIGH SKILLS MAJOR (SHSM) HOSPITALITY

In order to meet the high demand in the coming years for quality skilled workers in the Hospitality Industry, Turner Fenton is excited to offer this unique program. The Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) at Turner Fenton involves students completing a package of courses that meets the needs of all students with an interest in developing the skills necessary for a career in the Hospitality Industry. The Hospitality Industry acknowledges and supports the program through certification and appropriate industry placements. In order to complete a SHSM in hospitality, students:

1. complete a package of 10 specific courses (see chart below).
2. complete Industry Certification.
3. obtain job experience (ex. co-op work experience, job shadowing, job twinning).
4. document the industry essential skills using the Ontario Skills Passport.
5. gain "Reach Ahead Experience" (ex. through an apprenticeship program or post secondary institution)
