### Highlights:

- ❖ David Suzuki Secondary School opened in September 2011. The school serves Grades 9-11 students living in the Springbrook community of Brampton. By 2013-2014, the school will offer programming for Grades 9-12 students.
- ❖ David Suzuki Secondary School opened with a French Immersion program for Grade 9 students. Another grade of French Immersion programming will be offered in each subsequent year so that the program will be available to all grades by the 2014-2015 school year.
- ❖ The school is organized to support students to emerge as individuals who have a developed awareness of community needs, along with provincial, national and international issues especially as they relate to the environment in which we live.
- ❖ Students are provided with exposure to state of the art facilities and equipment, rich programming and unique learning opportunities, along with a layered learning support system to ensure student success.
- ❖ At David Suzuki Secondary School, there is a full range of extra-curricular activities and clubs that support student involvement in sports, student leadership, music, drama, dance, social justice, business and technology, reflecting the varied interests and cultural diversity of our students.

### More about David Suzuki Secondary

Our namesake, Dr. David Suzuki, is Co-Founder of the David Suzuki Foundation and an award-winning scientist, environmentalist and broadcaster. He has won numerous academic awards and holds 24 honorary degrees in Canada, the U.S. and Australia. He was elected to the Royal Society of Canada and is a Companion of the Order of Canada. On June 10, 2002 he received the John Drainie Award for broadcasting excellence.

Dr. Suzuki is also recognized as a world leader in sustainable ecology. He is the recipient of UNESCO's Kalinga Prize for Science, the United Nations Environment Program Medal, UNEPs Global 500 and in 2009 won the Right Livelihood Award that is considered the alternate Nobel.
